Reminder 2023 CHRISTMAS PARTY SLIDE SHOWS

As a fun portion of the BI Photo Club Christmas Party, we will be showing members home grown slide shows as entertainment. Your shows can be on any topic of interest to you. They can be serious, humorous, about travel, your pet cat or any other topic that strikes your fancy. There are no winners or losers, just sharing your life's interests.



A few ground rules for submitting a show:

- 1. Your show should be a maximum of 4-5 minutes
- 2. The format for submitting will be m4v
- 3. The shows can be color or B/W
- 4. You should allow each image to be on screen for about 4-5 seconds to keep the audiences attention. A 4-minute slide show would include about 60 slides, a 5 minute one, about 75 slides
- 5. To give you an idea of image to music coordination, a show run time should coincide with the length of the music chosen. The run time of each slide can be more or less than 4 seconds to accommodate music that is slightly longer or shorter than the 4 seconds per slide run time.

For submitting your shows:

- 1. E-mail Rob (<u>rcw@kwarch.com</u>) by **December 5th** to let him know the title of your show and the expected run time. This will help in organizing the total # & length of all the shows for the evening.
- 2. Bring you slide show to the Christmas event on a **thumb drive at about 6:30** for us to download to the computer. Or better yet, send to Diane Hutchings dhutchings10@msn.com by Dropbox, Google or other transfer formats for large files.

Join in & showcase your images! Get started early on your show. Our Party is on December 13th at 7 PM at the usual place.


Club Membership

PhotoShop Tidbits

One of the things that I've found interesting and fun about PhotoShop (PS) is how many different ways there are to accomplish the same thing. Each of us has "our" way that we have found and is comfortable using to get to the end results that we're looking for.

ave you ever made a Selection in PS so that you can use an Adjustment Layer to change the look of that Selection only to decide that you want to make an additional adjustment to the same Selection? What do you do? Try to make another identical Selection? Well, here's one way to make a Selection and use that same Selection to make numerous adjustments to it.


Let's say that you make a Selection of the sky and want to adjust the brightness/ contrast and then make an adjustment for the exposure. Follow these steps:


- Make the selection that you want
- Select the Adjustment Layer that you want (in this case the Brightness/Contrast)
 see photo #1
- Make your brightness/contrast adjustments
- Select your <u>next</u> Adjustment Layer (in this case the Exposure)
- Click on the original Adjustment Layer (in this case the Brightness/Contrast)
- For a Mac hold the Opt key (Alt key for a PC) while clicking on the original Adjustment Layer
- While holding the Opt/Alt key, slide the original Adjustment Layer on top of the new Adjustment Layer (in this case Exposure) and release see photo #2
- A window asking if you want to "Replace Layer Mask" click yes see photo #3
- Make the exposure adjustments that you want


You have now duplicated your original Selection and used the new Adjustment Layer mask to edit your Selection.

Now let's say that you've continued to edit your photo (cropped, dodge & burn, etc.) and you've decided that you need to make further adjustments to your original sky Selection. Let's say that you want to adjust the Hue/Saturation of the sky (your original Selection). All you need to do is follow the same steps as above. This will effectively make a triplicate of your original Selection of the sky and make your adjustments as needed.

I have found this very handy and easy to use. Hope this adds another tool in that PS toolbelt for you.... Norm




